

LIQUIDS, AEROSOLS AND GELS

New Rules effective 01August 2007

Applicable on flights into and out of the Philippines

Each container of liquids, aerosols or gels in your carry-on baggage must be 100 milliliters or less. Partially filled containers larger than 100ml will not be accepted. All the containers must be sealed in a transparent, one-liter plastic bag. You are only allowed one bag. Any resealable bag of one-liter capacity or less is allowed, e.g. 20 x 20 cm or 15 x 25 cm.

You must still carry through the screening point prescription medicines. Baby products and non-prescription medicines that you need for the flight are also allowed. Proof of need may be required.

When you get to the screening point, you will have to surrender any liquids, aerosols or gels greater than 100ml that you still have with you, including duty free. The new rules also introduce random frisk searches as part of the screening process.

Please prepare your plastic bag before you check-in. you will then have time to put any containers that are too big into your check-in baggage.

Items Allowed

Food – sandwiches, fruit, vegetables, other solid food

Baby Products – baby milk, sterilized baby water, baby juice, baby products in liquid, gel or paste form, baby food powder

Medicines – essential prescribed medication, essential non-prescribed medication, insulin, medical devices

Cosmetics – talcum powder, contact lenses and contact lens solution

Items Not Allowed

Drinks – any drinks in cans, bottles, plastic containers, etc

Liquid Cosmetics and Toiletries – all cosmetics and toiletries in liquid / gel form, e.g. perfume, moisturizer, foundation, lip gloss, mascara, toothpaste, hairspray, etc.

Food – any liquid based food products in packets, tubes, plastic or tin containers, e.g. jams and syrups, sauces, yoghurts, etc
